

AIDS/HIV in the Workplace

Introduction

This practical course provides guidance on how to handle a colleague who is HIV positive. It educates workers about the disease and the impact the epidemic has on an organisation, in order to create an informed and caring workforce.

Course Objectives

- Understand the effects of HIV/AIDS on the immune system
- Know how HIV/AIDS is transmitted
- Know what behaviour is safe and what behaviour carries the risk of HIV/AIDS transmission
- Know what guidelines and assistance are available to support workers with HIV/AIDS and recognise own role in creating a caring work environment
- Understand the implications of the HIV/AIDS pandemic for society, the economy, a business sub-sector, an organisation and a specific workplace

Understanding HIV/AIDS and its effect on the immune system

Understanding how HIV/AIDS is transmitted

- Outlining the effect of body fluids on the transmission of the virus
- Identifying the ways in which HIV is transmitted and the conditions necessary for transmission
- Understanding the actions that an HIV positive mother can take to lower the risk of infection to her child
- Outlining precautions used in SA to ensure that blood products are HIV-free



Knowing what behaviour is safe and what behaviour carries the risk of HIV transmission

- Outlining the relationship between human behaviour and HIV/AIDS
- · Identifying ways in which the individual can avoid contracting or spreading the virus
- · Classifying behaviour that carries a risk of contracting the virus as high, medium or low risk
- Identifying situations that have a potential to spread HIV/AIDS in the workplace and rating them in terms of high, medium and low risk
- Describing common fears and misunderstandings about the transmission of the virus in the context of the workplace
- Understanding how untreated STDs greatly increase the risk of transmission

Knowing what guidelines and assistance are available to support workers with HIV/AIDS

- Analysing your organisation's policy on HIV/AIDS or the Department of Health's "Guidelines for developing a workplace policy and programme"
- Identifying possible problems that a worker with HIV/AIDS could encounter and how to create a caring situation in the workplace
- Outlining the importance employers play in playing a proactive role in addressing the AIDS pandemic
- Explaining the availability of HIV/AIDS prevention and wellness programmes provided by medical schemes and how to access them
- Identifying the treatment options available to a person with HIV/AIDS
- Understanding the rights of workers in respect of HIV/AIDS
- Draft a code of behaviour in the workplace
- Addressing the stigma surrounding HIV/AIDS

- Analysing the effect of AIDS orphans on the economy
- · Identifying the effect on the economy of a population composed mainly of children and the aged
- Understanding the cost of medical care for employees with HIV/AIDS and the implications for employers
