Introduction

The National Certificate: Hygiene and Cleaning Supervision, Level 3, is a practical occupational qualification aimed at individuals working in supervision positions in the hygiene and cleaning industry.

The programme is the third in a learning pathway for those who have completed the NC: Specialist Hygiene and Cleaning at NQF Level 2. It builds on skills and knowledge gained and focuses on developing additional cleaning and management skills to offer quality service and professionalism across a range of different cleaning services and specialist sectors.

It offers career advancement and articulation into other related fields within cleaning services as well as entry to level 4 qualifications in allied industries.

Target Audience

The qualification is suitable for individuals who are working in the hygiene and cleaning industry as cleaners or supervisors and want to develop more advanced skills as well as management competencies within the sector.

Cleaners, team leaders and supervisors working in commercial, hospitality, laundry, carpet, upholstery, hospital and industrial cleaning will all benefit from this programme.

Entry Requirements

- Competency in Communication (English) at NQF Level 2.
- Competency in Mathematical Literacy at NQF Level 2.
- Competency in the cleaning sub-field applicable to area of specialisation.

Workplace Requirements

- Access to appropriate workplace environments.
- Active support by a mentor or supervisor.
- Access to a PC, software and the internet.

- Identify business opportunities in a cleaning environment.
- Manage time and work processes in a business environment.
- Manage, motivate and work within a team.
- Provide consistent quality and safety standards.

Core Modules

- Apply personal safety practices on a wastewater treatment works
