

#### Introduction

The accredited Skills Programme: Work in a Team, NQF level 2, is an occupational programme for individuals working as junior managers, project managers of small projects and team members of larger projects.

It covers the core and support functions of an organisation, the role of selected work units in relation to the core business and the difference between line and support functions within an organisation. In the second focus area of the programme, delegates will understand working as a member of a team, collaborating with team members to improve performance, building relationships, respecting team differences and developing strategies to deal with conflict.

The Skills Programme offers career progression in the manufacturing and production sector and articulates into the NC: Production Technology, level 3.

The Skills Programme is aimed at junior managers and leaders of small projects and sub-projects. It is also suitable for those working as team members of medium to large projects. Projects can be of a technical or business nature and can fall across economic sectors, including manufacture, engineering and production.
