Introduction

The accredited Skills Programme: Health and Safety Skills, NQF level 2, is for individuals working in different positions in manufacturing, production and engineering. It is a practical entry-level occupational programme.

On completion of the course, delegates will be able to follow procedures to deal with safety, health and environmental emergencies and minimize damage and injury. They will be able to keep their own work areas clean, safe and productive and apply health and safety standards. Identifying hazards and safety issues in the context of the industry and workplace are covered in detail.

The Skills Programme offers career entry into the manufacturing and production sector and articulates into the NC: Production Technology, level 2.

Target Audience

The skills programme is aimed at individuals under supervision, working in different job roles in engineering and manufacturing environments. It is suitable for those working with production processes, maintenance, quality control and occupational health and safety in industries such as metal, motor, mining, food and beverage, engineering and energy.

Entry Requirements

- Competence in Communication and Numeracy at ABET level 3.

Additional Requirements

- You will need access to appropriate workplace activities to complete the practical components of the skills programme.
- Active support and mentorship by your manager.
- Access to a PC, software and the internet.
